She holds a Bachelor's Degree on Child Development from Hacettepe University where she worked with deaf and hard-of-hearing children, creating curriculums on music and language development. Burcu has appeared at venues including the Hatch Shell, Massachusetts State House, WBUR CitySpace, and Shalin Liu Performance Center. She has toured the U.S. singing performing in a variety of genres.

Barbara Hill (Chorus) is highly regarded for her artistry and versatility and specializes in performing and recording the music of the Middle Ages through the present day. As a soloist, she has appeared with Musica Sacra (Boston), Masterworks Chorale, Seven Times Salt, the Old North Festival Chorus, and is the soprano cantor at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross, Boston. As an ensemble member, she performs with Ensemble Altera, Cappella Clausura, Emmanuel Music, and the GRAMMY-winning ensemble The Crossing. An enthusiastic supporter of new music, she especially enjoys the opportunity to premiere and record new works. She is thrilled to be making her Carnegie Hall debut as a soloist in Heidi Breyer's *Amor Aeternus: A Requiem for the Common Man* this July. With the Cantata Singers, she recently appeared as alto soloist and Reginald Mobley's cover in Handel's *Dixit Dominus* and the alto soloist in Bach's BWV 130. She also sang in the Asian premiere of Jacobsen's *For Sixty Cents* with Cong Quartet. She participated in University of Michigan's Singing Down the Barriers to learn more about African-American song literature, and actively participated in song projects with Boston Opera Collaborative and Cantata Singers Chamber Series. Jeannette is engaged to premiere Guerilla Opera's newly commissioned chamber opera *HER:alive/un/dead* by Singaporean composer Emily Koh in the summer of 2022 and in Boston Opera Collaborative's Opera Bites production as Becca in Beth Ratay's *In the House of Serenity* in 2023.



MEET THE DIRECTORS



Melissa Bernstein (Director) founded Newton Theatre Company in 2013 and has directed most Newton Theatre Company shows. She was also the Founder and Executive Director of the Newton Youth Players. Over the program's history she directed over 50 productions involving close to one thousand youth actors. Melissa holds a Ph.D. in Theatre from the University of Colorado at Boulder, an MFA in Playwriting/Theatre Education from Emerson College and a BA in Theatre from SUNY-Binghamton.



Amelia LeClair (Music Director) received her Master of Music in choral conducting and subsequently founded Cappella Clausura in 2004 with the intention of enlightening audiences about female composers throughout history. Over the past two decades, Amelia has worked with many local arts institutions, including Choral Arts New England, the Newton Cultural Council, the Greater Boston Choral Consortium, and more; she is also an Affiliated Scholar at the Brandeis University Women's Studies Research Center.



THE HISTORY OF THE ATREIDAE

Years before the start of the Trojan War, Agamemnon, son of Atreus, is King of Mycenae. His brother, Menelaus, becomes King of Sparta after marrying Helen. In turn, Helen's sister Clytemnestra comes to Mycenae to marry Agamemnon. The two have several children, including Iphigenia and Orestes.

Some time later, war breaks out after Paris takes Helen from Sparta to his homeland, Troy. Agamemnon assembles the Greek forces at Aulis so that they can sail to Troy and demand Helen's return, but the troops are met with a setback: Artemis has halted the winds that will carry them across the sea. The priests say that the only way to appease her is for Agamemnon to sacrifice his oldest daughter, Iphigenia. Agamemnon agrees to do so. All of the Greeks, including Clytemnestra, believe Iphigenia to be dead— although Euripides posits that Artemis spirits her away at the last moment.

While the war drags on, Clytemnestra remains in Mycenae. She sends her youngest child, Orestes, to stay with relatives and plots her revenge against her husband for murdering their daughter. After a decade, Agamemnon returns home victorious. Less than a day later, Clytemnestra murders him in his bath.

Once he has come of age, Orestes returns home to avenge his father. He murders Clytemnestra but is subsequently plagued by the Furies— monsters who torment killers of their own blood kin. Although Athena eventually absolves him of guilt, Apollo gives him one final task to purify himself: he must journey to Tauris and return a statue of Artemis to its place in Athens.
