She is also the artistic director of ImproNati, the only Italian theater company in New England. She obtained her Master's degree in Art, Music and Theatre at the University of Bologna, Italy. He currently teaches classes in making and performing masks, and offers performances and residencies to schools throughout the state through Young Audiences of Massachusetts. 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About Commedia

Commedia dell'arte is a traditional style of Italian popular theater that started in Italy in the mid-fifteen hundreds and expanded throughout Europe. Using classic stock characters and masks, performers were able to creative inventive new plays using archetypes that audiences already knew and loved. Commedia troupes often performed outdoors in public spaces,

making this style popular with people of all backgrounds. With its emphasis on physicality, improvisation, and slapstick comedy, commedia was able to transcend language barriers. Commedia traditions and stock characters have made their way into contemporary popular culture, and can be seen in live performances like Punch & Judy shows and television programs like The Simpsons.
